

**Clark County Law Foundation's
2021 Let Freedom Ring Art Contest**

Official Contest Rules

Eligible Participants: Clark County Law Foundation's (CCLF) Let Freedom Ring Art Contest is open to students attending a public or private school, or being home schooled, in Clark County, Nevada and in grades K-12 or the equivalent. Students may only make individual submissions to the Let Freedom Ring Art Contest.

Background: The Let Freedom Ring Art Contest is held for Law Day in conjunction with CCLF's annual Liberty Bell Award ceremony. The Let Freedom Ring Art Contest asks participants to create an art piece exploring the procedural protections afforded to all of us by the U.S. Constitution and why the preservation of these principles is essential to our liberty. Sponsors: The Let Freedom Ring Art Contest is cosponsored by Clark County Law Foundation, the Daughters of the American Revolution, and Jo Mackey Elementary School (Sponsors). Contest prizes are made possible through generous donations and support. Contest Eligibility Requirements: Eligible Participants are allowed to submit an art piece, which may be represented in two-dimensions, to be entered in the Let Freedom Ring Art Contest. Participants are encouraged to use their creativity and originality to make art pieces in any medium desired (including, but not limited to, drawings, paintings, films, photographs, graphic novels, comics, etc.). Two-dimensional artwork should be no larger than 11" x 17". Each submission must be accompanied by a signed Let Freedom Ring Art Contest Entry Form. All participants under the age of 18 years of age must have their parent or legal guardian sign the Parental Permission Release on the [Art Contest Website](http://www.clarkcountylawfoundation.org/let-freedom-ring/art-contest.html). All participants must assent to the republication, reproduction, or any other use of the submissions and the likenesses, personas, and voices contained therein by CCLF and must submit all applicable releases (see "Clearances"). Additionally, each Let Freedom Ring Art Contest Entry Form must be signed by a parent, guardian, teacher, student over the age of 18, or other person over the age of 18 certifying the submission is the original work of the participant. Submissions are subject to verification for compliance with these Rules. Participants are not limited to one entry, but will only be eligible to win one prize.

To Enter, Eligible Participants Must:

1. Read and agree to the Let Freedom Ring Art Contest Rules. To do so, you may find the Let Freedom Ring Art Contest Entry Form and a copy of the Rules on the [Art Contest Website](http://www.clarkcountylawfoundation.org/let-freedom-ring/art-contest.html).
2. All submissions must be accompanied by a signed and completed Let Freedom Ring Art Contest Entry Form signed by the Eligible Participant or parent/guardian as applicable.
3. Create an art piece that highlights the theme *"Advancing the Rule of Law, Now."*
4. Submit a digital representation of the art piece (photograph, short video clip, high resolution scanned image) to CCLF via email at:

LFRArtContest@clarkcountylawfoundation.org with the completed Entry Form, Parental Permission Form, and appropriate releases using the subject line: LFR Art Contest Entry.

5. To be eligible for prizes, all Let Freedom Ring Art Contest entries must be received by CCLF by October 11, 2021.

6. All Eligible Participants under the age of 18 must have their parent or guardian sign the Parental Permission Release, and each Let Freedom Ring Art Contest Entry Form must be signed by an adult.

7. Winners will be required to prove eligibility requirements and compliance with these Rules.

Contest Description:

1. Participants will compete in three grade categories: K-5, 6-8 and 9-12.
2. Selection of winners and runners-up in each grade category will be based on originality, creativity, adherence to the theme, and overall quality.
3. The selection committee will choose no more than one winner and one runner-up in each of the three grade categories from among the eligible entries that, in the sole discretion of CCLF, meet minimum quality standards and best reflect the theme.
4. Winners will be notified on or about October 16, 2021.
5. Awards will be presented as part of CCLF's annual Liberty Bell Award ceremony on October 28, 2021 at 3:00 p.m.

Contest Prizes: Prizes for the runners-up will be awarded, the value of which will not exceed \$100.00 each. Prizes for the winners will be awarded, the value of which will not exceed \$250.00 each.

Privacy: Any and all names, contact information, and related should be submitted only on the Let Freedom Ring Art Contest Entry Form and other required forms. Names, contact information, or any other personally identifiable information should not be included within the submission (for example, on a "credit roll"), as the submitted pieces may be displayed on publicly accessible websites. If personally identifiable information is presented within the submission, CCLF may, in CCLF's sole discretion, void or deem the submission ineligible.

Submitted Art: All submissions must be the original work of the participants. Participants must not have granted any other person or entity prior right to use the piece. Submissions will not be accepted or eligible if they include - in the sole judgment of CCLF - any content that contains or appears to contain:

1. Profane, obscene, or inappropriate material.
2. Endorses, encourages, glorifies, or condones drug use, underage drinking, alcohol abuse or any other illegal activity.
3. Nudity, profanity or gratuitous violence.
4. Inappropriate language.
5. Any express or implied commercial endorsement.
6. Any derogatory characterization of any person or group based on age, race, color, gender, gender identity and expression, sexual orientation, religious beliefs, marital status, mental or physical disability, citizenship, creed, national origin, physical appearance, political affiliation, union membership, or other unethical or unlawful factors.
7. Depictions of any conduct, language or other context deemed inappropriate.
8. Any actual or apparent copying or other infringement of another's intellectual

property rights.

Clearances: Each participant is solely responsible for obtaining from all applicable individuals or entities any and all required rights, releases, consents, clearances, licenses, and other authorizations necessary to exploit and otherwise use their submitted piece in any and all media. Clearances required include, for example:

1. Location releases.
2. Releases from any person whose name, voice, likeness or persona is referenced, shown, or otherwise used in the submitted piece.
3. If any individual depicted is under the age of majority, participants must obtain the signature of the individual's parent or guardian on the applicable Parental Permission Form located on the [Art Contest Website](#).
4. By submitting entries, participants warrant that the contents of the submitted piece does not infringe on any copyright owned by another, and/or that the content of the piece is within the bounds of the fair use doctrine.
5. Participants also confirm that to the best of their knowledge, any statements made in the submitted piece are true and do not violate or infringe on the rights of third parties.
6. All necessary clearances must be obtained and provided to CCLF prior to selecting the art piece as a winning piece.
7. CCLF may disqualify any submitted piece at any time if the participant has not obtained all necessary clearances.

Conditions of Participation:

1. By entering, participants agree to defend and indemnify CCLF, its Sponsors, and all of their principles, subsidiaries, affiliates, directors, officers, employees, and agents from any and all liability for any injuries, loss, or damage of any kind arising from or in connection with the Let Freedom Ring Art Contest as a result of receiving participants' submissions and/or misuse of any prize.
2. Each participant agrees that CCLF may, at its sole discretion, retain the original or a copy of the submitted art and the participant releases CCLF from liability for any loss or damage thereto.
3. Each participant, by submitting the art, consents, approves and authorizes CCLF and its Sponsors the right to use, replicate, broadcast, webcast, podcast, link to or from, syndicate, or otherwise exhibit or display the submitted pieces in its original or an altered form or format.
4. Each participant grants CCLF and its Sponsors the unqualified, unrestricted, worldwide, irrevocable, perpetual and royalty-free right to use his or her name, logo, marks, submission entries, and other distinctive identification in connection with promoting or marketing the Let Freedom Ring Art Contest or its theme, and future contests, materials or as CCLF determines.
5. The rights described in these official rules begin immediately upon participants' submission of an art piece.
6. CCLF and its Sponsors have no obligation to post or display any submitted piece and may at their discretion remove any submitted pieces at any time.
7. The participant releases CCLF and its Sponsors from any and all claims by third parties or the participant in connection with the submitted piece.

General Conditions:

1. The Let Freedom Ring Art Contest is governed by the laws of the state of Nevada and participants consent to the exclusive jurisdiction and venue of the state and federal district courts located within Clark County, Nevada for any causes or controversies arising therefrom.
2. CCLF and its Sponsors reserve the right to void entries it deems associated with electronic or nonelectronic tampering.
3. Should technical or other difficulties arise that compromise the integrity of the Let Freedom Ring Art Contest, CCLF may cancel, modify or suspend the Let Freedom Ring Art Contest without notice. In that case, CCLF reserves the right to award the prizes from eligible entries received before the cancellation.
4. CCLF and its Sponsors are not responsible for any technical malfunction or service outage related to the Let Freedom Ring Art Contest.
